

# Frequently Asked Questions (FAQs) About the Final Exam

## 1. Are we allowed to retake the exam if we fail?

- Yes, but only after 5 days.

## 2. What if we fail again after the second attempt?

- You'll need to schedule a meeting with the Registrar during your clinical session at CAL ACE for a remediation quiz.

## 3. Are these questions the same as the State exam?

- Not exactly, but the context is similar. Situations, terms, and names have been adjusted.

## 4. If I retake the exam, are the questions arranged in the same order?

- No, the questions will be shuffled..

## 5. Can I translate the questions into a language I understand better?

- Yes, you can. However, please note that State exams are conducted in English.

## 6. How do I know if I passed or failed?

- Like the Module Quizzes (1–17), Google Forms will email your results after submission.

## 7. How will CAL ACE know my score?

- The scores are monitored by the admin.

## 8. Why are the exam questions different from the lectures?

- The exam questions are not identical to the lectures, but the context is the same. Situations, terms and names may be modified.

## 9. Where else can I study further?

- Read the **CNA Guidebook**.

- Explore relevant content on **YouTube** and other online resources.

#### **10. Are there practice tests from CAL ACE?**

- Yes! During the upcoming clinicals at CAL ACE, you will have opportunities to practice.

#### **11. I can't access the CNA Network!**

- If you're unable to access the CNA Network, go to the **Student Portal** and scroll down to the **[Final Exam]** button, which is located in the middle of the page.

#### **12. Can I take breaks during the test?**

- We recommend training yourself to complete the test in one sitting since the State test is designed to be completed in one go.
- However, short breaks are allowed if necessary.

#### **13. Is this an open-note or open-book exam?**

- No, it is not an open-note or open-book exam.
